## PADMASAMBHAVA





### Vaishravana Statue

- Dharma Protector and Wealth Deity
- Swore an oath to Shakyamuni Buddha to protect the Dharma
- 12" fully gilded statue
- To be placed alongside other protectors in the Main Temple

### Padmasambhava Statue

- 22" fully gilded standing Padmasambhava statue
- To be placed in the small temple
- On the right alcove of the central Shakyamuni Statue

# Honouring the Lineage Project: Details

## Why Vaishravana Statue?

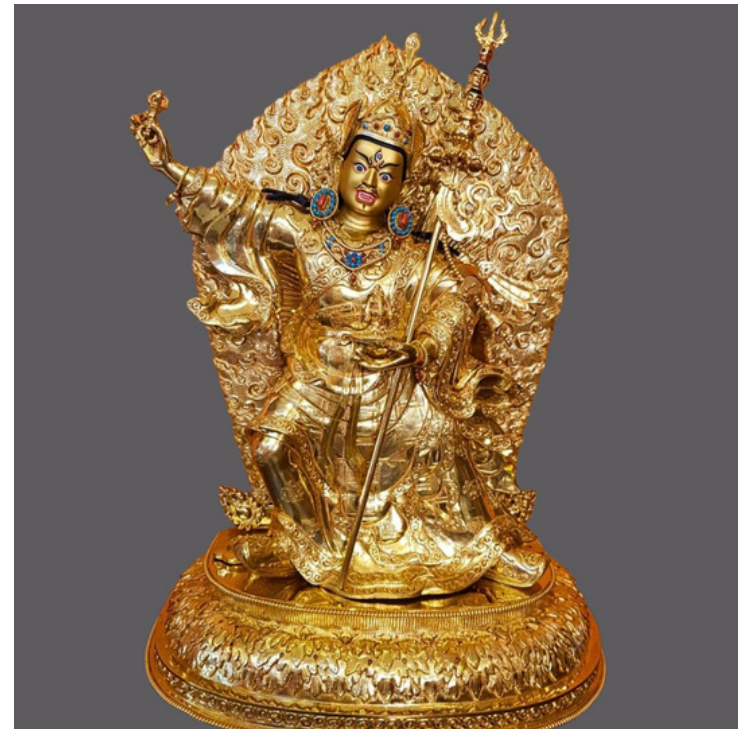
- Vaishravana is a complex Buddhist deity who embodies many strands of thought and belief.
- He is considered a protector of the Dharma.
- Tibetan Buddhists consider Jambhala's sentiment regarding wealth to be providing freedom by way of bestowing prosperity so that one may focus on the path or spirituality rather than on the materiality and temporality of that wealth.



# Honouring the Lineage Project: Details

## Why Padmasambhava Statue?

- Padmasambhava (Guru Rinpoche) is perhaps the most universally cherished realized being in all of Tibetan Buddhism.
- Padmasambhava came to Tibet from India in the 8th century and helped establish a pure lineage which is still practiced today by all four major schools of Tibetan Buddhism around the world.
- Lama Zopa Rinpoche lauds Padmasambhava's contribution to humanity: "Due to Padmasambhava's great compassion, Tibetan Mahayana Buddhism flourished in Tibet and now has spread throughout the entire world. Because of that, so many people have experienced the path to enlightenment and achieved enlightenment. Due to his great compassion, the lives of infinite number of sentient beings have become meaningful."





# Illuminating the Buddhas

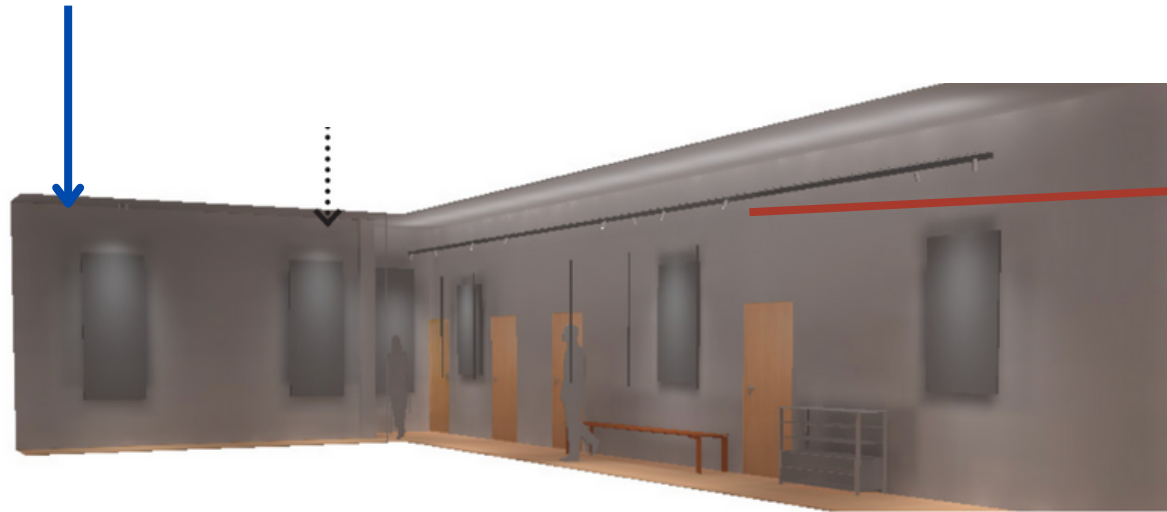

# Illuminating the Buddhas 2023: North Corridor

In the North Corridor of Jamyang London we have installed six thangkas, including Guru Shakyamuni Buddhas and White Tara, and in the Gompa four large Thangkas, three of which were donated by Geshe Namdak, including Medicine Buddha and Green Tara.

# Illuminating the Buddhas 2023: Main Gompa



Miniature bracket mounted spotlights to window reveals



Floor mounted spotlights mounted at rear of shrine to illuminate centre and sides



Retain / replace existing spotlight



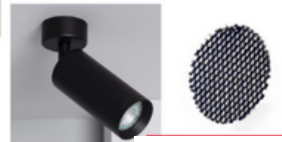
Paint ceiling white similar to entrance, surface mounted spotlight, upward



Surface mounted track mounted just below cornice with rod mounted spotlights for both wall hanging locations



Replace existing fixture w/ honeycomb louvre for glare control



# Illuminating the Buddhas 2023: Main Temple

We have installed four big thangka in the Main Temple.



Miniature bracket mounted spotlights to window reveals



Floor mounted spotlights mounted at rear of shrine to illuminate centre and sides



Retain / replace existing spotlight



Paint ceiling white similar to entrance, surface mounted spotlight, upward



Surface mounted track mounted just below cornice with rod mounted spotlights for both wall hanging locations



Replace existing fixture w/ honeycomb louvre for glare control

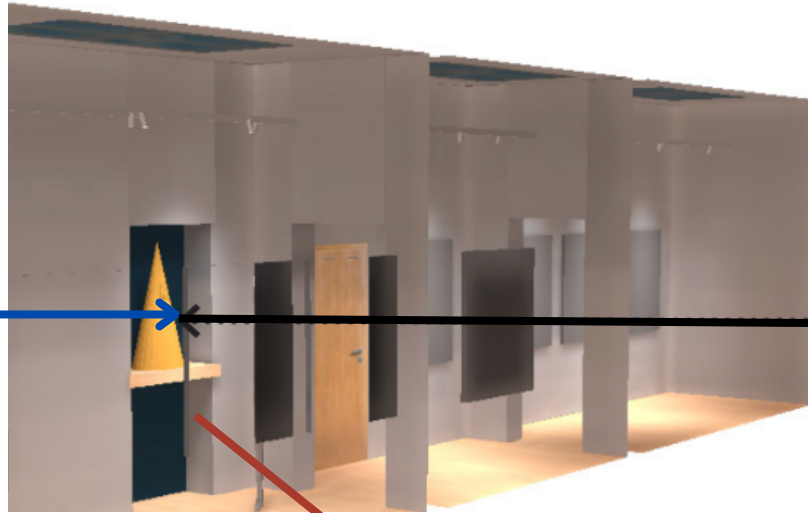

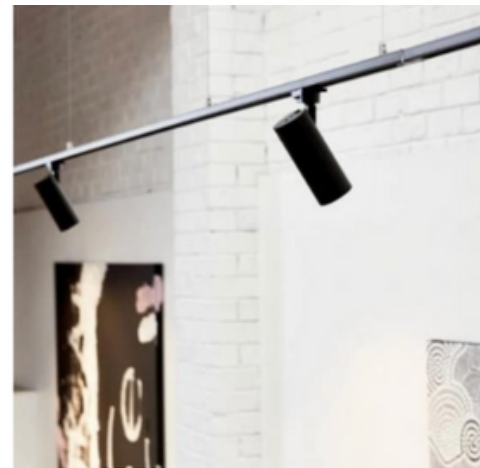
**Chenrezig statue**
